Sailing School has started with a bang!

The **after-school program** had almost 40 participants split into two 2-week sessions. This is significant, as 35 participants were brand new to sailing!

Our **facility and grounds** look exceptional with the help of two clean-up/set-up days in May. Many thanks to our board and other volunteers.

In preparation for the season **Seth Wilkinson** took and passed his US Sailing Level 2 certification and **Ella Fontenot** and **Gavin Divelbiss** took and passed their US Sailing Level 1 certification to qualify them to become our two newest instructors!

The weekend of June 22nd/23rd our Instructors and Junior Instructors scrubbed boats, organized sails, practiced motorboat maneuvering, honed teaching skills, participated in community building and icebreaker activities, rigged boats and 7 got CPR/First Aid certified. We are fortunate to have a **wonderful group of dedicated instructors** who come to work every day jazzed up about teaching the sport they love to eager participants!

We are fortunate to have **Head Instructor Ben Crosby** again this summer, leading the charge on everything from teaching racing, to boat repair to running general day to day camp activities. We are excited for a 9-week camp season culminating in a new program titled '**Summer Finale**'. It is designed to give those with experience more freedom with their sailing time and will be more personalized instruction.

The **Winnepesaukee Annual Regatta (WAR)** is scheduled for July 25th. This is organized by LWSA, generously supported by the Winnepesaukee Yacht Club, and typically attracts participants from several other sailing schools around New England. As well as this event we will be making opportunities available for our sailors who love to compete to attend other regattas.

Our **adult lessons** are also in full swing with Pete Crosby and Samih Shafique teaching 3 full classes. Once again, this year we are seeing an increase in **private lessons and outings**. It has proven to be a great way to meet a wide range of needs and interests.

Due to the incredible support of the board, and the tireless work of our sailing school number 1 volunteer Al Posnack, we are already having a fantastic season!
