Once again the Jimmy Fund auction set a new record for donations received!


Over 150 kids will pass through the youth sailing program this summer. They are enjoying themselves and learning! (And after six weeks, not a single rainout day!)



13th ANNUAL Labor Day REGATTA

Saturday, August 31, 2002
Plus — Friday Night, August 30 "Frying Pan Race,"

The LAKE WINNIPESAUKEE SAILING ASSOCIATION (LWSA), cordially invites you to participate in our 13th Annual Regatta. You are also invited to participate in a special two-handed Fun Race on Friday Evening (not part of the Regatta). If you have never participated in a regatta before, this is the one to try.

On Saturday morning there will be a brief "Introduction to Racing" for those who are not familiar with the procedures.

Early registration is requested (there is an additional fee of \$10.00 after 8/28). Final registration will close at 9:30 AM on Saturday 8/31. The Skippers' Meeting will be held at 10:00 Saturday morning at Fay's Boat Yard in Gilford. There will be multiple classes subdivided into racing classes that can use spinnakers and cruising classes that are limited to flying headsails. The number of classes will be determined by the spread of the PHRF ratings of the registrants.

The racing will include as many windward-leeward races as conditions permit for the Racing Classes and triangle courses for the Cruising Classes. Cruising classes may be sent on island courses if conditions warrant.

There will also be the annual "Frying Pan" two-handed race twice around Welch Island on Friday Evening, August 30 for the real fanatics. Sign up will be at Fay's Boat Yard at 5:00 PM on Friday. Sequence will start at 6:00 PM near the SW corner of Welch Island. This event is separate from the Regatta.

All boats will be rated using the PHRF handicap system. If

you don't have a rating certificate, please call (603) 692-6922 weeknights to request a temporary PHRF rating. The PHRF Handicapper will issue a temporary certificate just for this event. Entry is limited to sailing vessels 20 feet or longer. We will be sailing under USSA Rules and LWSA Sailing Instructions (copies will be available at the Skippers' Meeting). We suggest that you have a copy on board. You are, of course, required to have the normal safety equipment on hand.

A limited number of overnight moorings are available at Fay's Boat Yard for the weekend on a first-come, first-served basis. If you need dockage, please contact Fay's Boat Yard directly.

On Saturday afternoon following the racing, there will be an awards ceremony on the docks at Fay's Boat Yard. Beer, soda and munchies will be available. Proceeds of the regatta will help fund our program for next year.

Fay's Boat Yard will be hosting a Labor Day Party that evening with food and live music for its customers. Participants of the regatta are invited to attend but you need to make a reservation directly with Fay's no later than August 28th. Donations will be accepted during the evening.

An Official Entry Form is included with this *Broad Reach*. Please fill it out and return it at your earliest opportunity to the LWSA at the address indicated.

On behalf of the Race Committee, and The LWSA, we look forward to seeing you.

2002 LWSA 13th ANNUAL REGATTA SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

Friday, August 30, 2002

1700 - Sign up and Skippers' Meeting (Fay's Boat Yard) for two-handed race for the "Frying Pan Trophy". This will be a fun race and is NOT part of the weekend Regatta. The race will be twice around Welch Island.

1800 - Starting sequence begins near the Southwest mark off Welch Island.

Saturday, August 31, 2002

0930 - Final registration closes for all boats ("Rec Room" Fay's Boat Yard)

1000 - Skippers' Meeting ("Rec Room" Fay's Boat Yard)

1200 - Starting Sequence begins (south of Welch Island)

1700 - Social Activity begins on the "A" Dock at Fay's Boat Yard

1730 - Awards Ceremony (Fay's Boat Yard)

OFFICIAL NOTICE OF RACE LWSA ANNUAL DOUBLE HANDED FRYING PAN RACE

Friday, August 30, 2002

- RULES: The race will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing (2001 – 2004), the prescriptions of US Sailing, the rules of PHRF New England, the LWSA/WYC Combined sailing instruction for the 2002 season, and any other applicable rules
- 2. ELIGIBILITY: Any boat over 20 feet possessing a current PHRF certificate may participate. This is a double-handed event. Boats are restricted to a Skipper and one crewmember.
- ENTRY & FEES: Boats must register by submitting a completed Entry Form along with the entry fee of \$15 (\$10 for US Sailing members). Registration is at 1700 Friday, August 30, 2002 at Fay's Boat Yard.
- CLASSES: Boats must register to compete in either the Racing or Cruising Division. Cruising class may not use spinnakers.
- RACING AREA: The race will be started southwest of Welch Island.
- 6. COURSES: The course is traditionally twice around Welch Island. The official course will be posted on the Race Committee Boat as described in the Sailing Instructions. The race committee may shorten the course to once around by displaying code flag S before the first boat passes the Start/Finish line.
- 7. **SCHEDULE**: Friday August 30, 2002 1700 Registration & Skippers Meeting 1800 Warning Signal
- SKIPPERS MEETING: A Skippers Meeting will be held at Fay's Main Dock per the schedule to reiterate information contained in the Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions and to answer any questions.
- SCORING SYSTEM: Finishing position is determined by corrected PHRF time.
- 10. AWARDS: The winner of each division will enjoy the distinction of having their accomplishment recorded on the perpetual "Frying Pan" trophies which hang in the Fay's Boat Yard Chandlery.

OFFICIAL NOTICE OF RACE LWSA 13th ANNUAL LABOR DAY REGATTA

Saturday, August 31, 2002

- 1. **RULES:** The race will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing (2001 2004), the prescriptions of US Sailing, the rules of PHRF New England, the LWSA/WYC Combined Sailing Instruction for the 2002 season, and any other applicable rules.
- 2. **ELIGIBILITY:** Any sailboat over 20 feet may participate. Boats that do not have a current PHRF certificate may compete by obtaining a temporary certificate. Such boats are advised to pre-register to allow sufficient time for accurate handicapping.
- 3. **ENTRY & FEES:** Boats must register by submitting a completed Official Entry Form along with a check made out in the appropriate amount payable to LWSA. Pre-registration should be postmarked no later than August 28, 2002 and mailed to LWSA, PO Box 7047, Gilford, NH 03247. The registration fee is \$30 (\$25 for USSA members). There is a late fee of \$10 for entries received after August 30, 2001. The entry fee includes one Social Ticket for the skipper. Additional fees may be paid for social activities ashore. See entry form for details.
- 4. **CLASSES:** Boats must register to compete in either the PHRF Racing or PHRF Cruising Division. Cruising Division may not use spinnakers. The divisions will be further subdivided as required.
- 5. **ADMINISTRATION:** Race headquarters for the event will be "The Rec Room" at Fay's Boat Yard, 71 Varney Point Road, Gilford, NH.
- 6. RACING AREA: Races will ordinarily be started on "The Broads". In the case of extreme conditions, the race committee may elect to start races southwest of Welch Island.
- 7. **COURSES:** The race committee will set "Buoy" courses as it deems appropriate for each class. Course signals will be posted on the committee boat as per the Sailing Instructions. Island courses may be set for Cruising Classes if conditions warrant.
- 8. SCHEDULE:

0900 Registration, Pickup Packet

1000 Skipper's meeting

1200 Warning signal for first race

Social activities and prize giving ashore to follow racing (See master schedule)


- SKIPPERS MEETING: Sailing Instructions and class assignments will be available at the skippers meeting on Saturday. A Skippers Meeting will be held as per the schedule to reiterate information contained in the Notice of Race and Sailing Instruction and to answer questions.
- SCORING SYSTEM: The low-point scoring system (Appendix A4 of the racing rules) will apply. One race will constitute a regatta. All races will be counted.
- 11. PRIZES: First and Second Place awards will be made in all classes and Third Place Awards will be made in classes with five or more boats.


