"Michelob Cup" Draws Record Entries

The eighteenth edition of "The Race for the Ribbon" sponsored by NH Distributors and Michelob Beer saw nearly ideal sailing conditions, as well as excellent participation. The sixty four entries received at race time was the largest number on record. As usual Race Chairman Terry Pratt was ably assisted by wife Carolyn, both at registration and on the Committee Boat. The one problem of the morning was that the record number of entries took longer than usual to receive and enter into Chief Scorer Ray Lanza's computer.

The course was set with a starting line just south of Welch Island, the first turning mark was Middle Ground Shoal, then around the southeastern tip of Diamond Island, before returning back to the start. The easterly breeze which had been only five to eight knots earlier in the day increased into the ten to twelve knot range by race time. Unfortunately, it also clocked to the southeast which turned the upwind

leg into a single tack "dash" for Middle Ground Shoal, followed by a second single tack parade to Diamond Is. The secret was to keep clear air which was a challenge with 20 or 30 of your fellow sailors - up close and personal.

Race Division winners and co-skippers Bryan Marshall and Casey Nickerson were one of the first starters and indeed kept their San Juan 24 in clear air for the entire race. In second place was the Kanegsberg Crew aboard the J27 *Time Bandit* followed by The extended Mackey family on the S2 9.1 *Mischief Maker*. In the Cruising Division Helen and Ray Lanza took top honors in *Impetuous* a Pearson 31, also owing their success to clear air. (They also beat nearly all of the racing fleet.) Second place went to another sailing couple Eileen and Gary Tefft with Brenner and Everett Fuller sharing crew duties aboard the Capri 25 *Swimmer*. Yet a third sailing couple took third place.

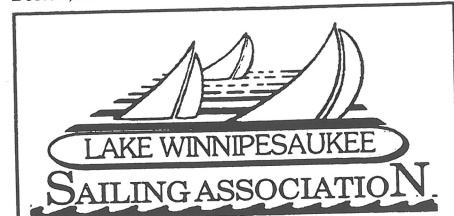
Our San Juan 24 regatta is progressing well. I hope to raise some money for Sandy to spend and to

Minutes - General Meeting, May 13, 1995

Commodore Mike Herz called the meeting to order at 7:25 at the Gilford Church parish hall.

Sailing Awareness Day: About 25 to 35 people came to Fay's Sales office. Twenty people actually went out for rides on seven boats. Chair Sue Sparks did a great job. We would like to do it again Saturday June 24th. Commodore Mike's power boat is ready for the race tomorrow. The skippers meeting is at 10 am with a noon start.

Committee Boat: Alan Kanegsberg spoke to Don Sibson about the committee boat. Both boats are under cover at BJ's. The Witch Way has not been painted since we bought it (6 to 8 years ago). We need help with the work. We have an estimate of \$1200 that includes an electric horn for \$155, a marine VHF for \$167, recovering the canvas on the deck and interior and installing the triactic. Without the horn and VHF the cost would be about \$900. The following two motions were passed: **MOTION:** To authorize Don Sibson and John Goodhue to proceed with work on the Witch Way to be completed by June 24th. They are to call Mike Herz for assistance. **MOTION:** To accept the Triactic for \$700.

Racing Issues: The San Juan 24 Notice of Race will be included in the next "Broad Reach". The Friday night series begins the second Friday in June. (June 9) Golf handicaps as outlined in Ray Lanza's article in the "Broad Reach" were discussed. We need to promote dialogue among

So far 32 students have registered for classes. This is an excellent start. More information was given out this afternoon at Sailing Awareness Day. Curriculum review will begin next week. Helen will contact Carter and Laura for input. Laser racks are needed by 1996. They must be accessible by small people. Helen will talk with Scott Davis, Casey Nickerson, R.J. Sparks and Bob Garland about researching possible designs. Dave Mackey has information on a "bunk bed" design. Helen will talk to Carter and Laura about the T-shirt design. Philip will contact Scott Auberton who has the design from last year. The committee would like to award each CIT a gift certificate for \$50 per week (AM & PM) of two weeks (AM or PM). The cost would be \$400. Helen will recheck with Merrill about using the Seaway and the rec room. Helen will write to Paul requesting the Wellcraft be launched on Monday and hauled on Friday.

1st Annual San Juan 24 Championships

Eligibility: The regatta is open to any skipper or owner who wishes to participate. Participants must meet all regatta requirements, and must have paid all event fees before becoming official competitors.

Rules: This regatta will be governed by the 1993-1996 International Yacht Racing Rules (IYRR), the class rules of the San Juan 24 class association, this notice (except as to any modifications by the sailing instructions), and the sailing instructions. The top finishing yacht will be awarded the WYC San Juan 24 trophy.

Scoring: The low point scoring

system (IYRR, Appendix B2) will be used. The Percentage Penalties (paragraph 2 of IYRR Appendix B1) shall apply.

Launching/Hauling: Launching will be available at Fays Boat Yard, Gilford, N.H. on Friday June 17, 1995 between 8:00AM and 5:00PM and by appointment. Moorings will also be available at Fays. To arrange for launch or moorings contact Mike Weisberg at (603)293-8000.

Entry: Each entry must be submitted in the form attached here to (a photocopy will be accepted). The entry fee is \$40.00 (\$35.00 for USSA members) by cash or check payable to Lake Winnepesaukee Sailing Association (LWSA). All proceeds are to benefit The LWSA Youth Sailing Program.

B. The area known as "Sanders Bay".

Miscellaneous

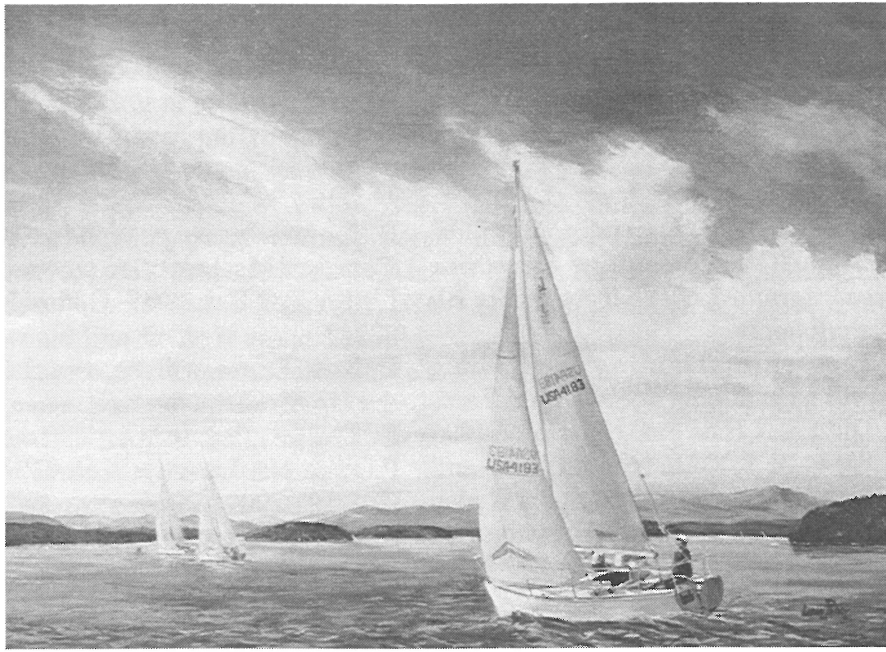
