Open your calendar and mark May 18th, it's the Tune up Race and the beginning of a new season! Start your day with coffee and donuts at the morning membership/event and informal island race. After the race we'll convene the May General Meeting. Bring an hors d'oeuvre, we'll provide liquid refreshments including champagne to toast the start of the new season. By the way, if you see a new sailor introduce yourself and invite them to join us.

Last year was a tough year from a fiscal perspective. The race committee refurbished the chase and committee boats and youth sailing bought additional Optimists for the instructional fleet. Everything was within budget until the engine on the chase boat died. While the association is still in the black it doesn't have the normal operating reserves it needs at this time of year.

The financial situation has motivated us to take a serious look at fund raising. The most significant contribution to the bottom line has always been the Labor Day Youth Sailing Auction. Unfortunately the auction is becoming almost unmanageable. It runs too long, interferes with the meal and is a huge amount of work. The goal for this year is to scale it back to about an hour. To make that possible, we're going to try to obtain a limited number of the most popular items well ahead of the event. Other items that come in at the last minute will either be held for the next year or sold through a blind auction. Limiting the auction will undoubtedly reduce the funds raised.

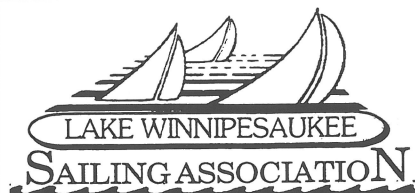

The auction also doesn't help the current cash flow situation. Last year we ran a number of 50/50 raffles throughout the season. A few years ago the association raffled an Avon Dinghy by selling tickets at events and local shopping plazas. Neither worked particularly well. It was amazingly difficult to actually sell the Avon tickets and it didn't net the expected proceeds. While the 50/50s were moderately successful it's not much fun to continuously ask for money.


So what's the solution? This year we plan to do a single Youth Sailing Raffle to supplement the smaller auction. There will be a maximum of 400 tickets at \$20 each. First prize is \$1000, second prize is \$500 and third prize is \$250. Tickets will be available starting with the Michelob Cup and the winners will be drawn at the Labor Day Regatta. Winners do not have to be present at the drawing.

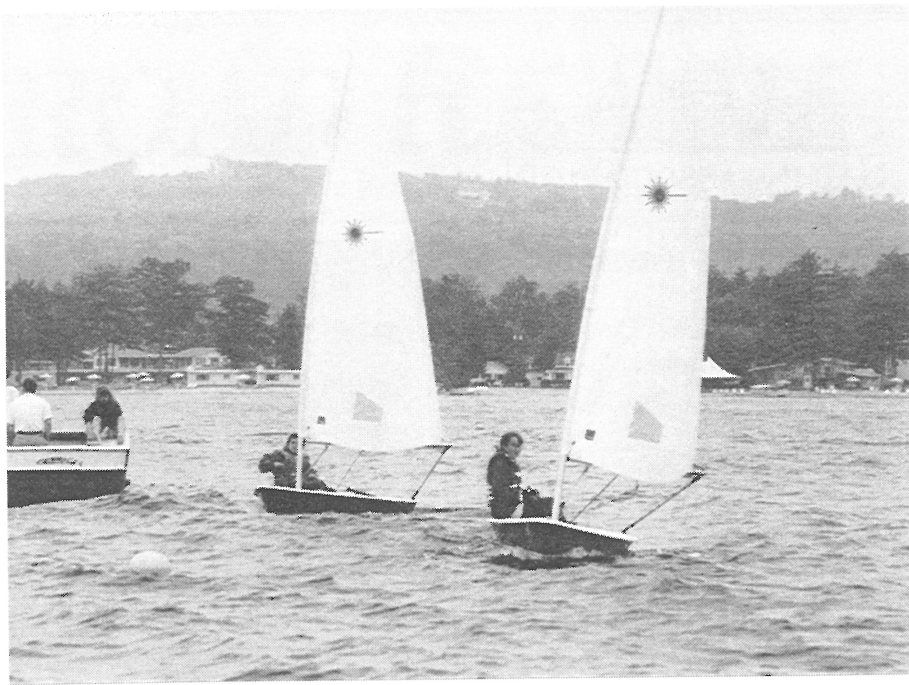
The meeting was called to order at 7:34 PM after changing locations to the Friedel residence. Those in attendance enjoyed the atmosphere and view.

A letter received from Robert Hurd, with a donation to Youth Sailing was read. Helen Lanza offered to write a thank-you note.

The Youth Sailing Registration Form was erroneously omitted from the Broad Reach however, it will appear in the next issue. The flyers will not be ready until the beginning of May.

Alan Kanegsberg mentioned that we currently have over 30 members. He is optimistic about this season but has a cash flow problem at the moment.

Youth Sailing Report: Alan and Phil will not be able to repair the Lasers. Alan will contact Mike Weisberg about this. Mike Herz donated a shed to store parts. Six Optimist Dinghies were stored in the shed during the winter months. The shed was moved and there is some concern over the condition the boats are in now. An inflatable dingy can be purchased from the Mackeys for use during Youth Sailing lessons. The use of this boat would save "wear and tear" on the Wellcraft. Publicity will be carried out by Mo Heckman. The Sailing lesson instructors are Laura Mackey and Megan Heckman. Helen approached Merrill about sponsoring T-shirts for the Youth Sailing students. He offered to pay half the cost if we used the vendor he supplied. Donna McMann will approach her company about sponsoring the other half. The LWSA embroidered logo tooling is at an embroidery company call Say-It-In-Stitches. Helen will research the cost for the instructor's jackets.
